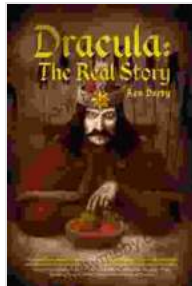

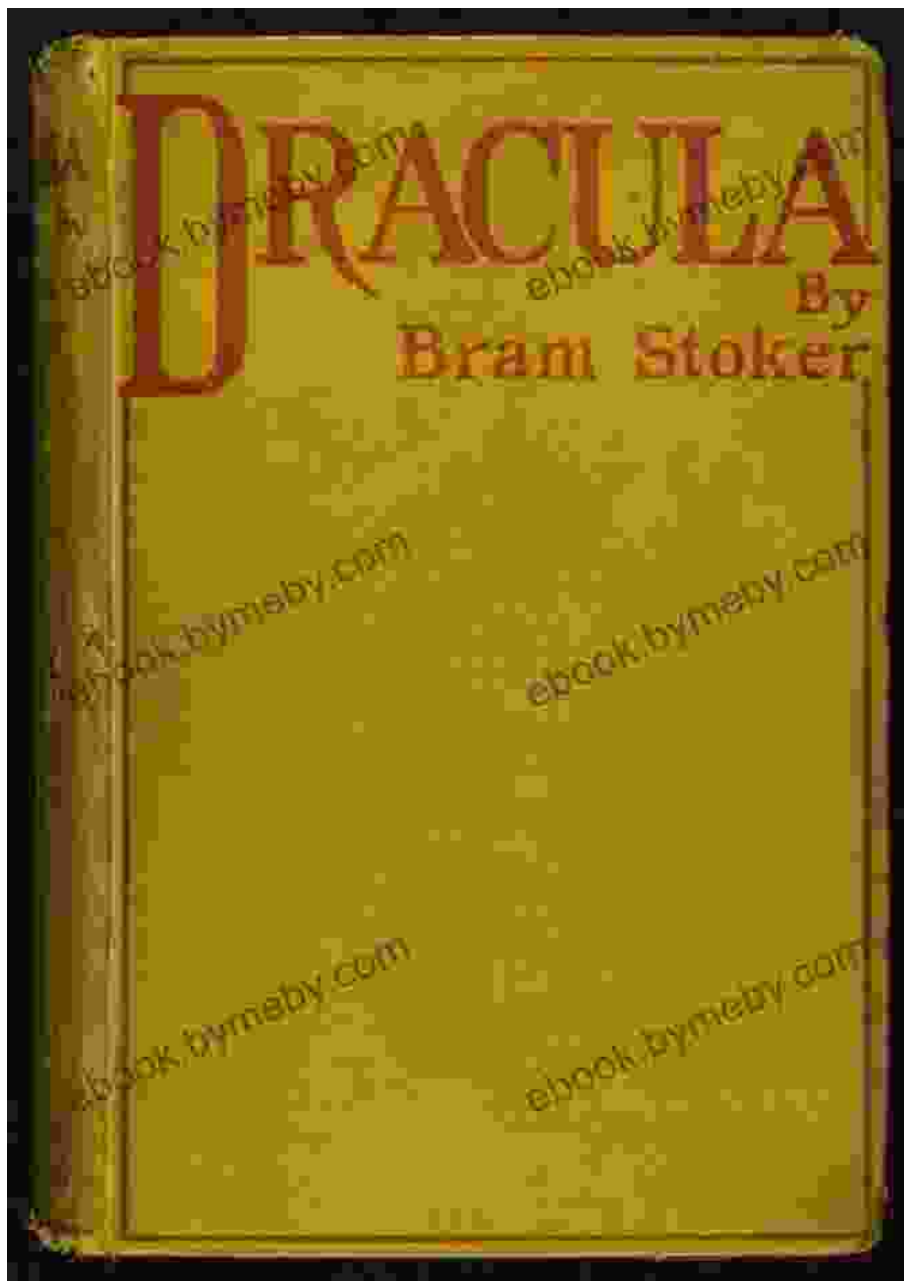


Vlad the Impaler's gruesome method of execution, which inspired the term "vampire"

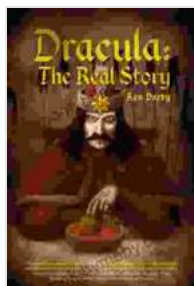

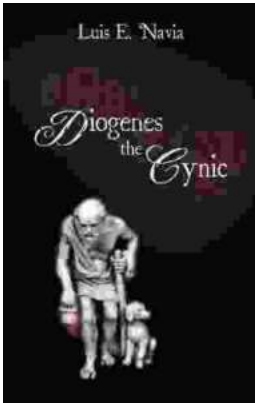

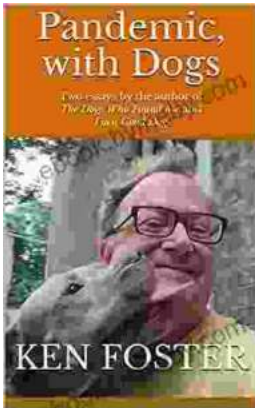
